High School Courses

English (I-III) Review:

This course is designed for 9th-11th grade students who need to make up English credits. Emphasis will be on vocabulary-building techniques, writing skills, reading comprehension, and grammar review.

Spanish (I-II) Review:

This course is designed to review the language skills taught in Spanish. Successful completion of this course, which reinforces grammar, vocabulary, verbal and written skills, should prepare the student for success in the next level of Spanish. To advance to the next level students must earn a B or better.

Algebra I Review:

This course is designed to focus on algebraic principles, their application and problem-solving. The course also prepares students to continue in mathematics and develops the skills necessary for Geometry.

Geometry Review:

This course covers the required concepts of Euclidean geometry with emphasis on logical deduction. This class is not designed for younger students wishing to take an accelerated class.

Biology Review:

This course is a lab science course that is designed for review of required areas in Biology, such as: cellular chemistry genetics, evolution, and ecology.

Chemistry Review:

This course is a lab science course that is designed for review of required areas in chemistry, such as: atoms, chemical kinetics and the interaction of matter.

World History Review:

This course covers major themes and events from the freshmen World History class. This class will focus on reading comprehension, test taking skills, and geography.

U.S. History Review:

This course covers major themes and events from the junior U.S. History class. This class will focus on essay writing, test taking skills, and geography.

Each course equals one semester of credit. The summer school course is averaged into the GPA. It does not replace the previous grade.

Students will use the same textbook as used during the school year. They should have the book in class the first day of summer school.



Preparation for 2009-10 AP Classes

Spanish - Pre AP:

This course is designed to prepare students for all facets of the Advanced Placement Spanish course and, ultimately, for the AP Spanish exam at the end of the school year. This course is mandatory for AP Spanish students. B or better must be earned to maintain AP Spanish enrollment.

Biology - Pre AP:

This course is mandatory for Advanced Placement Biology students. This course, in conjunction with the regular school year course, will prepare the student for all facets of the AP Biology exam. If the course is impacted, the top 25 students with a minimum grade of B- or better will advance to the fall semester.

For Incoming Salesian Students

English A:

This course is designed to reinforce language arts skills developed in elementary school to prepare students for the challenges of Salesian High School curriculum. Emphasis will be on vocabulary-building techniques, writing skills, reading comprehension, and grammar review. Students must purchase a novel for the class.

There is also a \$40 book fee for the two workbooks provided. Fee payable to Salesian High School in the finance office.

Algebra Introduction:

This course is designed for students who have taken Pre-Algebra or Algebra but need to reinforce the skills already learned in order to be successful in high school Algebra.

Algebra I Accelerated:

This course is designed for students who have had Algebra and would like to begin taking Geometry as a freshman at Salesian. A grade of B or better qualifies a student for Geometry.

Spanish I Review:

This course is designed for students who have previously studied beginning Spanish. Successful completion of this course with a grade of B or better will qualify a student to be placed in Spanish II.

Study Skills Class

This course works to prepare incoming freshmen for the transition to high school. The course will focus on note taking, outlining, time management, organization, studying, and test-taking strategies. No textbook needed.

Art/Graphic Design Camp: June 29 - July 2

Students will create projects using various art media. They will grow and develop through the instruction from Salesian's Advanced Placement Art Studio teacher and the support of current Salesian art students. In the area of graphic design, students will learn basic design and layout principles. Students will have exposure to current design software while using our state-of-the-art computer lab.

Science Camp: July 13-17

Students will experience hands-on science experimentation to develop critical thinking and study key concepts. Students will examine the principles of Chemistry and Biology using the Salesian science labs. Through hands-on research, students will work through the scientific method. Students will engage and interact with technology.

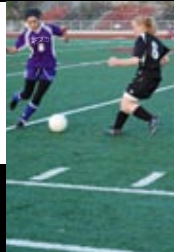
