

SALESIAN COLLEGE PREPARATORY COVID-19 RULES AND REGULATIONS **(Last updated March 18, 2021)**

The novel coronavirus, COVID-19, has been declared a worldwide pandemic by the World Health Organization. COVID-19 is extremely contagious and is believed to spread mainly from person-to-person contact. As of March 15, 2021, over 500,000 people in the United States have died from COVID-19. As a result, federal, state, and local governments and federal and state health agencies recommend social distancing and have, in many locations, prohibited the congregation of groups of people.

Salesian College Preparatory (“Salesian”) has put in place preventative measures to reduce the spread of COVID-19; however, Salesian cannot guarantee that a student or their family, friends, or to anyone with whom such persons may have contacted will not become infected with COVID-19. Further, attending any activities associated with Salesian such as, but not limited to, attendance at school, attendance for athletics, participating in any club or other co-curricular activity, any school-related function of any sort on or off its campus (“School Function”) could increase the risk to a student or their family or friends of contracting COVID-19.

Notwithstanding, anything in these rules and regulations as they are amended from time to time at the sole discretion of the administration of Salesian and as supplemented by any corresponding Appendices (the “Rules”), each of our students, parents, teachers, faculty, and staff must comply with the most stringent of the following: Any national proclamation, any State of California proclamation, and Contra Costa County proclamation, or as it impacts any individual student, parent, teacher, faculty or staff the local proclamation in the county in which any such person resides.

It is expected that these Rules and Regulations will be changed from time to time with little or no notice. Please check back periodically to review them on Salesian’s Remote and Hyflex Program Learning tabs at <https://www.salesian.com/about/communications/hyflex-learning>.

The Rules shall incorporate the Social Distancing Protocols of Contra Costa County, which can be found at <https://www.coronavirus.cchealth.org/health-orders> and <https://www.cdph.ca.gov/Programs/OPA/Pages/NR20-336.aspx>.

Students must avoid all physical contact with each other, including celebrations, handshakes, high-fives, etc. Students must at all times on campus properly wear masks except momentarily when the student may be eating or drinking. After eating or drinking and in between such activities, the student must wear the mask.

Parents must check their student every day, and all Salesian employees and off-campus coaches must also complete a self-check. If any of the following symptoms (“Symptoms”) are present, the student or employee, as the case may be, must remain at home and not attend school until the Symptoms have not been evident for at least three (3) days:

- Fever above 100 degrees Fahrenheit (Touchless Thermometers available in the front office) or chills

- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- New loss of taste or smell
- Dry cough
- Congestion, sneezing, or runny nose not related to a previous condition
- Sore throat
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

Wearing of Masks: When required under the Rules to wear a mask, everyone must wear the mask appropriately, and the mask shall meet all Dress Code requirements concerning masks. The masks can be cloth or surgical masks. Since surgical masks often break, anyone relying on a surgical mask must have a backup mask in their possession. Each student and parent or guardian must watch the “Wearing a Mask Like A Pro” video (English or Spanish links follow) showing the appropriate way to put on a mask, wear a mask, and take off a mask. **The nose and mouth areas must be covered fully.**

Practicing Social Distancing Rules Off-Campus, Quarantine After Travel, Certain Social Gatherings, and Activities

Salesian students and employees are expected to maintain social distancing, mask-wearing protocols, and conform to the local laws of Contra Costa County and the State of California at all times, on and off-campus. Our students and employees should be examples for our community at large. In an effort to increase the safety of our campus for all concerned, students or employees who engage in activities as set forth below must follow the quarantine rules and refrain from entering the campus for in-person HyFlex school for ten (10) calendar days after the activities have ceased or provide proof of a negative Covid test taken at least five days after ceasing such activity:

- **Travel out of the country: Upon return, a student or employee must self-quarantine for ten (10) days or show proof of a negative COVID test taken no sooner than five (5) days after the return.**
- Participating in any out-of-state athletic activity whether or not it involves air travel: Upon return, a student or employee must not attend in-person HyFlex school for ten (10) days or show proof of a negative COVID test taken no sooner than five (5) days after the return. **See on our website - *Rules and Regulations for Athletics and Co-Curricular Activities (As of March 22, 2021)* for rules concerning participating in indoor**

sporting events for such students who submit to testing requirements.

- **Attending a mass gathering indoors of any type that would violate the then-current rules in Contra Costa County: A student or employee must self-quarantine for ten (10) days after such attendance or show proof of a negative COVID test taken no sooner than five to seven (5 - 7) after the event. Quarantine After Close Contact With a Person With a Positive Covid-19 Test

A student or employee must self-quarantine for ten (10) days after coming in **Close Contact** (as defined by the CDC and as set forth below) or show proof of a negative COVID test taken no sooner than five (5) days after the Close Contact.

You have been in Close Contact if you have been within 6-feet of an infected person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period* starting from two (2) days before the infected person's illness onset (or, if the infected person was asymptomatic, starting from two (2) days prior to such person taking their COVID test).

The above rule for Close Contact does not apply to any student or employee who as received their last scheduled vaccine at least two weeks before and not more than three months before the Close Contact, nor does it apply to a student or employee who has recovered from a confirmed case of COVID-19 two weeks before and not more than three months before the Close Contact.

** For calculation of the cumulative 15 minutes, individual exposures added together over a 24-hour period (e.g., three 5-minute exposures for a total of 15 minutes) are taken into account.*
