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Prom Guidelines Information:

- The Salesian Prom Is A Formal Dance.
- Students Not In Compliance With The Dress Code Will Not Be Admitted To The Dance.
 - The Student's Parents Will Be Notified
 - The Student Will Be Sent Home

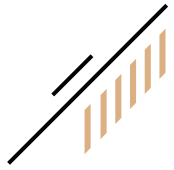
If You Have Any Concerns About Your Formal Attire, See Mrs. Flannery Or Mr. Swanson For Approval.

Acceptable Formal Dress:

- Tuxedos, Suits (With A Jacket, Shirt, and Tie), And Dress Shoes. A Shirt And Tie Must Be Worn ALL Evening.
- Evening Dress Or Gown (Strapless or Spaghetti straps are OK) And Dress Shoes.
 - Black Athletic Shoes Are Okay.
 - If A Dress Has A Side, Front, Or Back Slit, The Slit CANNOT Be More Than 3 Inches Above The Knee.
 - If A Short Formal Dress Is Worn, The Hemline CANNOT Be Higher Than 3 Inches Above The Knee.

Unacceptable Formal Dress:

- Baseball Caps Of Any Kind.
- Non-Black Athletic Shoes.
- Dresses With Plunging Necklines Or Backs
- Dress Slits That Are More Than 3 Inches Above The Knee.
- Dress Hemlines That Are Higher Than 3 Inches Above The Knee.
- Dresses With Bare Midriffs Or Side/Back Cut-Outs.



Formal Dress Examples:



Dresses And Gowns: DOs



➤ **Strapless Or Spaghetti Straps Are OK.**

Dresses And Gowns: DONTs



- **Dresses Should NOT Have Plunging Necklines Or Backs, Bare Midriffs Or Side/Back Cuts-Outs.**

Dresses And Gowns: DONTs



- Slits CANNOT Be More Than 3 Inches Above The Knee, Side, Front, Or Back.
- Hemline CANNOT Be Higher Than 3 Inches Above The Knee For Short Dresses.

Suits And Tuxedos: DOs



- Jacket, Shirt, And Tie + Dress Shoes. Or Tuxedos.

Suits And Tuxedos: DONTs



- A Suit And Tie Must Be Worn The Entire Night. No Athletic Shoes Or Jeans.
- No Baseball Caps Of Any Kind Will Be Allowed.

Questionable Attire:

- Styles Are Always Changing And May Or May Not Fall Into The “What Not To Wear” Category.
 - For Example, Dress Shoes May Look Like Sneakers
- If You Feel That Your Attire May Be In Violation Of The Dress Code, Please Speak To Mrs. Flannery or Mr. Swanson.
- It Is Better For You If We Know Beforehand.
